

tournament Alloa Athletic however still have everything to play for knowing victory and three points would give them a strong chance of progressing to the next round. Greig Spence will always be adored by the Alloa Athletic fans and regarded in the greatest esteem regardless of which club he is currently playing his football. Greig moved to today's opponents Stenhousemuir in January, 2020 and is currently in a rich

vein of form so he will need to be watched this afternoon. Greig welcome back to the Indodrill Stadium.

In our last home match against Dundee "The Wasps" were disappointed to draw the game 3-3 after going 3-1 ahead in the second half. However there were some great performances on the park and the return of skipper Andy Graham for his first competitive

start since December. 2019. The game live on **BBC** Scotland served up a six goal thriller for the fans watching on the TV. however such was the decent of the fog in the second half at times it was difficult to see all the action. Today we will again have to be at our best to defeat Stenhousemuir and give us an opportunity to progress in the competition.

Alan Trouten had two

reasons to celebrate last week, firstly his two goals against Dundee on the Friday night which helped him claim his place in the SPFL Team of the week, along with the fact himself and goalkeeper Neil Parry both celebrated their 35th birthday on Saturday 7th November.

Congratulations to Stevie Crawford of Dunfermline Athletic, who won the SPFL Championship "Manager of the Month" for October, along with his club captain Euan Murray who was also named SPFL Championship "Player of the Month".

Alloa Athletic fans should note the change in two league fixtures, "The Wasps" were due to face Heart of Midlothian at Tynecastle on Saturday 31st October, however Hearts were defeating Hibernian that day in their Scottish Cup semi-final held over from last season, the new date will be Tuesday 24th November at Tynecastle Kick-Off 7pm. Also early in the New Year due to Championship clubs being involved in the Scottish Cup 2nd Round this season, the League match against Ayr United which was due to be played at Somerset Park on Saturday 9th January, 2021 will now be played on Tuesday 12th January at Somerset Park, Kick-Off 7pm.

This season's Scottish Cup competition has had to be revised due to the ongoing circumstances of the pandemic which have resulted in a need to condense the Competition, and a consequential necessity to adapt the format of the Competition for this Season, the Scottish FA Board has approved the revised format and Competition Rules for Season 2020/21 only.

The key changes to the Competition Rules, which have been implemented due to the condensed nature of the Competition, are as follows: •Entry point of clubs to the Competition and the number of ties in each round:

•Removal of replays for all matches with the outcome of any drawn match being determined by extra time and penalties, if required;

•The requirement to attempt to re-schedule any postponed match in the Preliminary Rounds, Round One and Round Two, during the first midweek after the original match date.

For the 2020/21 Competition the rules regarding the number of substitutes permitted in a match will revert back to no more than three being permitted in the match, and an additional

one permitted in any period of extra-time. The draws for the First Round Preliminary Draw, along with the Second Round Preliminary Draw were made at Hampden on Tuesday 10th November. Stenhousemuir enter the competition at the First Round stage on 26th December, 2020, while Alloa Athletic enter at the Second Round stage on 9th January, 2021.

STATS OF THE 2019-20 SEASON

It's a little bit odd being in the middle of November and playing a Betfred Cup group stage game instead of a balmy July evening, a dank November afternoon can be expected. In a similar vein, in the early season games of previous seasons I typically look back at the statistics surrounding Alloa's previous season. As

such, join me on an imaginary journey of going back to July, the warm glow of sunshine is on your neck, the Ochils are glistering (and no hint of snow or even the fog witnessed last week versus Dundee) as I reflect on some of the best statistics from Alloa's curtailed 2019/20 season.

2ND HALF OF THE SEASON SPECIALISTS

Despite the second half of the season being prematurely ended after 10 of the 18 regular games had been played, Alloa had still managed to repeat recent history by collecting more points in that time than the first half of the sea-

son. The 17 points collected in those 10 games eclipsed the 14 points gained up-to Christmas from 18 games. This was nothing new for Alloa though, as it was the sixth successive season that the Wasps were more successful in the second part of the campaign, and 15th time in the past two decades. Put simply, Alloa are the

second half of the season specialists.

JOINT 2ND HIGHEST OVERALL LEAGUE PLACING IN 93 SEA-SONS

Alloa's 8th place finish in the table resulted in an overall 20th place finish in Scottish football during the 2019/20 season. That ranks as Alloa's joint second highest overall league placing since joining the Scottish Football League in 1921. Although it was considerable behind the 6th place finish in Division One back in 1982/3 (which equated to 16th place in the country), it repeated the 8th place Championship finishes in 2013/4 and 2018/9, as well as the 20th position Alloa limped to in our only full season in the top tier back in 1922/3. Given the exceptional form of the Wasps in the months before the premature curtailment of the season I can only speculate that Peter Grant's Alloa side may have risen further in the table had the games continued. It was also only the 5th time from 12 attempts that the Wasps avoid-



ed the drop from the second tier (in the days since three and four leagues were introduced), meaning I consider that the Wasps should now be classed as an established Championship club, rather than merely being up in the Championship'. As such, despite the end of the season understandably feeling hollow, the Alloa team of 2019/20 should be rightly applauded as one of the best performing in the club's history.

7 GAME UNBEATEN LEAGUE RECORD

The 7 match unbeaten league run from Christmas until the end of February was Alloa's longest unbeaten stretch in the second tier since 1973; an astonishing 503 second tier games ago for the Wasps. It was therefore no surprise that Alloa were at points the form team in the Championship (last six games) at various points during that time.

GOALS GALORE ON THE ROAD

For the second successive season, the Wasps scored significantly more league goals in away games. Alloa's swift counter-attacks perhaps help explain why 21 goals were

scored on the road, compared with just 12 in the home league games played during 2019/20. The proportions were actually greater the previous season, when the Wasps scored double the number of goals on their travels (26) than at home (13). Despite scoring more goals in away games, Alloa still collected more points in home matches than away in both previous seasons, albeit only marginally (16 home points in 19/20, compared with 15 in away games; 20 home points in 18/19, compared with 19 in away games).

FROM LATE GOAL TO EARLY GOAL SPECIAL-ISTS

Under Iim Goodwin in the Championship Alloa were famed for scoring late goals, with a third (13) of Alloa's goals (39) scored in the final 15 minutes of matches during 2018/9. In direct contrast, the Wasps were fast starters under Peter Grant in 2019/20, with 55% of Alloa's goals (18/33) occurring in the first 30 minutes of games, and just 4 of the 33 goals coming in the final 15 minutes. For example, the home wins against Dundee United (1-0 in October), Arbroath (2-0 in January) and Inverness (2-0 in March) were all achieved with early goals in the opening half hour. I must admit that this early goal phenomenon was not something I was particularly conscious of during the season itself, but it perhaps signifies Alloa played more on the front foot under Grant, not relving so much on the neversay-die mantra (and hence a panache for late goals) under Goodwin. Alloa actually scored the highest proportion (61%) of first half goals in the Championship, with only three sides (Partick, Morton and

Dunfermline) scoring more of their goals in the second half, despite an equal number of goals (182) each being scored in the first and second half of Championship games last season. It is also worthy to note that Alloa scored more league goals (33) than third placed Dundee (32).

SHANKLAND... DOB-BIE... TROUTEN.

Beyond the superhuman scoring records of Lawrence Shankland and Stephen Dobbie, who scored the most goals at Championship level during the past two seasons combined? Jordan White

at Inverness, to earn his move to Motherwell, or Kevin Nisbet to persuade Hibernian to sign him? Nicky Clark perhaps given he'd been playing in a team at the top of the league, or even regular scorer Bob McHugh? Well no, none of those deadly strikers scored more than Alloa's attacking midfielder Alan Trouten. With 19 league goals and 32 when cup competitions are included, Trouten may have been behind Shankland (63) and Dobbie (54), but he was comfortably ahead of White (26). Nisbet (23), Clark (22) and McHugh



(21). It was another successful season for Trouten, notching 13 goals despite missing over a month with injury. In-fact, Trouten's scoring rate was slightly better in 2019/20 than it was during 2018/19, in terms of goals per minutes (1 goal every 173.4 minutes in 19/20, compared with 173.9 in 18/19) and goals per appearance (1 goal every 2.23 games in 19/20, compared with 2.32 games in 18/19). After his brace versus Dundee last week Trouten's record this season is 1 goal every 2 games, or a goal every 158.6 minutes, which

exceeds his two previous seasons (albeit from a much smaller sample size). Alan was also the joint second top goalscorer in all games played at Gayfield Park last season, despite only playing two games at the home of Arbroath! Trouten's three goals in those games meant only Bobby Linn outscored Alloa's deadly finisher.

TAGGART EVER PRESENT (AGAIN)

For the third time in four seasons Scott Taggart didn't miss a minute of the campaign, playing a full part in all 36 matches (and 3,240 minutes) during 2019/20. In-

fact, since joining the club in 2016 Taggart has now started 186 of the 187 games played, missing just 117 minutes of action from a possible 16,803 (equating to 99.31% of the playing time). Taggart is a model of consistency, with his 100th successive game and 200th total appearance for the Wasps fast approaching.

O'HARA'S BREAK-THROUGH SEASON

It would be remiss of me not to mention that Kevin O'Hara was Alloa's top goalscorer (14) and provider (10 assists) during 2019/20, meaning the young striker was directly involved in 50% of Alloa's goals last season. Kevin's 34 starts and 2.987 minutes of football eclipsed the combined totals he'd managed in the previous 4 seasons, meaning that a 3-year full-time move was no surprise, but richly deserved for the player.

INVERNESS HOODOO ENDED

Alloa's final match of the season ended a 19 game and 23 year wait for a league victory over Inverness. The 2-0 victory, arguably one of the Wasps finest performances of the season, was the first since an end-of-season dead rubber 1-0 win in 1997 (David Pew headed in the winner that day). ending a sequence of results which depressingly read DLLDLDLDLDLDDLL-DID.

DUNFERMLINE DE-FEATED

Alloa beat the Pars on league business for the first time since 1979 last November, thanks to a rare headed winner from Kevin Cawley. Although the Wasps had of course beaten Dunfermline during that time in the play-offs and in the cup, the simple pleasure of three precious league points from the Pars had alluded Alloa for over 40 years until that win in Clackmannanshire last season.

So, hopefully those statistics highlight that last season was another pleasing one for the Wasps, despite that feeling somewhat hollow at the time given the premature end to the campaign.

A FAN'S VIEW

Although Alloa perhaps rued what might have been after a 2 goal advantage was pegged back by Dundee last week, there were plenty of positives to take from a brilliant team performance. The visitors ultimately had to rely on both a quality individual and a controversial decision to drag them to a

share of the spoils in an entertaining encounter.

Alloa manager Peter Grant was clearly looking to address the concession of uncharacteristically soft goals against Dunfermline the previous week and plug any potential gaps. He added some experience and steel into his

team for a tough nights work that lay ahead. I had heard pre-match rumours that Andy Graham would return to the starting line-up, but nevertheless it was still a huge boost to see him on that team sheet when the starting 11 news filtered through - his first start since last December, Stevie Hetherington also

returned following suspension, and Adam Brown came back into the team.

The manager's thoughts, game plan and tactics ultimately worked to great effect in the first half- as Alloa went in at half time with a richly deserved lead. After a cagey opening 20 minutes from both sides,

Alloa started to gain a foothold and put together some excellent passages of passing play. The full backs- Ion Robertson and Liam Dick- were terrific on either side. Adam Brown was another I thought was outstanding in terms of positional play, drive and delivery. As a unit the team were very effectivewith Ray Grant and Brown covering the full backs when they ventured forward, squeezing space all over the pitch. It was a pin point cross from Brown which led to the opener-Thomson ghosting free at the back post to slot home. The Wasps almost doubled their lead iust before the break when Thom-

son was inches away from getting onto the end of Trouten's snatched effort in the 6-yard box.

As one of the recognised main title challengers in the league this season, a response from the visitors was inevitable, so it was vital that Alloa showed the required steel and concentration for the 45 minutes which faced them. Unfortunately, that flew out of the proverbial window when Dundee were level within the initial first couple of minutes of the 2nd half. Declan McDaid chested down a loose ball 20 yards from goal and fired home a fierce shot leaving Willison with no chance. With the pendulum now swinging in the

opposite direction continued on the

opposite direction, it was anticipated that Dundee would use the equaliser to push on towards the three points. But Alloa struck back and almost instantly regained the lead again. A scramble in the Dundee penalty area saw Cawley's toe poke saved before Alan Trouten stabbed home the rebound from close range. It was Alloa pushing on and they

continued on the front foot, increasing their lead just after the hour thanks to great work from Stevie Hetherington. The midfielder identified and found space on the right side of the penalty area and a really good first touch opened things up for a shot. Dundee goalkeeper Ferrie didn't necessarily cover himself in glory with his efforts to divert the ball and Trouten managed to get a touch on it for his second of the game.

In the final quarter of the game Alloa slowed a bit, which was understandable as they had put a lot into the match. But the defence was marshalled superbly by Andy Graham, the 37-year-old veteran



not missing a beatpretty miraculous after almost a year out. And this helped build Willison's confidence in goals, the young keeper having a really comfortable and composed outing throughout. He also produced a stunning stop from close range on a rare occasion where the Alloa defensive line was unlockedtipping over Paul McGowan's neat turn and shot.

Charlie Adam was obviously earmarked before the game as Dundee's main threat. But he wasn't enjoying his best evening up to that point in the

game. He showed his frustration when he left a bit on Ray Grant on the touchline in front of the dugouts. It was a bit naughty by the experienced midfielder, but the incident reflected how the game had gone for him. But as Alloa tired and gaps appeared, he began to show his quality more. Trouten conceded a rather soft free kick, and Adam's delivery into the area pinballed into the net to bring the visitors back into the game. I had sympathy for Willisonthose balls zipped into the 6-yard area are a nightmare for

goalkeepers. It presents a real conflict of thought- focussing on the onrushing attackers getting a touch versus following the flight of the ball. Adam was exerting more influence, and with 8 minutes remaining Dundee were handed the opportunity to equalise. Adam's fierce shot rebounded off Scott Taggart in the penalty area and the referee had no hesitation pointing to the spot. I'm not sure what the referee was expecting of Taggart. He had absolutely no way of avoiding the shot, it struck his shoulder at best

and his arms were by his side in a very natural position. It was poor decision making by ref Alan Muir- even by todays farcical "modern" handball rules- and extremely harsh on Alloa. Adam took the penalty himself and was never going to miss. Without a goal net his effort may have thudded off the Ochil Hills a few miles away.

Obviously it was a disappointing outcome in the sense that Alloa were ahead for long spells in the game and a 2 goal lead slipped away. Points are also vital in this shortened season,

so Alloa may well look back on the result with regret. But there were so many positives to take from the game. The work ethic of the team on and off the ball and their work as a unit being the most prominent plusses. The strikers also delivered, with both Trouten and Thomson on the scoresheet. There wasn't a single below par performance from any of the 12 players who contributed. It was no disgrace being undone at the hands of a man who has played at the very top level of the game until recently. Alloa nullified him for long spells of the game, but quality tends to prevail, particularly against tired legs. I only

wish Adam had been brought up in Alloa and not Dundeemavbe we would have been enjoying the fruits of his labour. Dundee may not openly admit it, but when their own private moments occur lames McPake would have been far happier to leave with a point than Peter Grant. And it took a highly contentious penalty award for the title contenders to do so

Stenhousemuir seems so far to be a real shrewd decision for Biabi after finding the form that earned his big move back in 2015. There is no doubt this number nine will need any introduction or warning as to what he is capable of. Greig Spence is the man in form for The Warriors after moving there from Arbroath last. The striker came through the youth ranks here at the Indodrill and then went onto enjoy

three different spells with the club with each one creating great memories. He was top goalscorer in lim Goodwin's League 1 assault as the Wasps narrowly missed out on promotion and also such a key part in the club's most historic result against Rangers scoring twice. Spence still has so much love for the club and that feeling is mutual with supporters. However, he is now firing in goals for today's rivals. 


