




























NEWSDESK

To-day we welcome Avr United FC to the Indodrill Stadium, welcoming manager David Hopkin, the players, officials and directors of Ayr United FC. "The Honest Men" have mirrored Alloa's results in our last three matches, winning one, drawing one and losing one since David Hopkin replaced Mark Kerr in the middle of March. "The Wasps" having defeated Oueen of the South 3-2 at Dumfries a fortnight ago would be disappointed to lose 3-0 at home versus Dundee in the BBC Scotland Live Friday night match. We now have two very important matches against Ayr United today at the Indodrill Stadium, and Arbroath next Saturday at Gayfield to gain vital league points to give us an opportunity to fight and stay in the SPFL Championship for the fourth consecutive season, keep on believing.

Scott Taggart is set to make his 200th first team appearance for the club if he plays against Ayr United in today's SPFL Championship fixture. Scott was signed by Jack Ross at the start of season 2016/17 and is now in his fifth season with "The Wasps". Scott has been a huge success for the club and a model of consistency, still only 29 years old and holding the record of 92 consecutive games for

an outfield player at the club it is hoped Scott will adding to that total in the future.

Liam Buchanan who recently made his 100th appearance for "The Wasps" and in the past has also served Ayr United, today celebrates his 36th birthday. He recently showed he has still an eye for goal scoring the winner in 3-2 victory over Queen of the South at Palmerston, another goal today

would be a great way to celebrate!

Prior to restart of Leagues One & Two last weekend there was a lot of movement involving ex Alloa Athletic players - Graeme Holmes moved from Edinburgh City to join Forfar Athletic, Ryan Finnie moved from Berwick Rangers on loan to Cowdenbeath, Daryll Megatt and Jordan Kirkpatrick both moved from Darvel on loan to Stirling Albion and David Cox moved from Cowdenbeath to Albion Rovers.

Faroe Islands on Wednesday 31st March at 7.45pm. Scotland's other opponents in Group F are Moldova who they will not face until 4th September,

2021 as they look to qualify for their first World Cup since 1998.

TAGGART SET TO JOIN THE 200 CLUB

In the post-WW2 era just twenty-two Alloa players have made 200 starting appearances for the club. Today could see a new entry on that exclusive list, with Scott Taggart scheduled to become Alloa's latest double centurion. To mark this milestone appearance it is only fitting to chronicle Taggart's successful Wasps career to date.

Scott has been a close-to ever-present

in the Alloa backline since being signed in the pivotal Summer of 2016 by lack Ross. The then 24-year-old had just been released by Dumbarton, surprisingly to some observers. and the Alloa manager was delighted to attract Taggart to the club. A re-built squad, the nucleus of which is still standing strong five years on, gave Alloa a real tilt at an immediate return to the Championship, with Taggart a

key component. Early assists for Greig Spence and Calum Waters goals showcased the attacking potential of Alloa's new right-back, as the Wasps unbelievably started the season with ten successive victories. An unheralded element of those early season halcyon days was the Alloa defence, who quietly chalked up seven clean sheets while the attacking players grabbed the headlines in that club record breaking

sequence of wins.

Taggart also enjoyed an early season trip to his Paradise, as the Wasps held out for 83 minutes against the then all-conquering Celtic, with Taggs competing admirably against a combined force of Kieran Tierney and James Forrest down his wing. That narrow defeat in the Betfred Cup Quarter-Final meant Scott couldn't emulate a career

highlight 1-0 win he achieved at Celtic Park three years earlier with Morton. As the season progressed Taggart showcased some of the qualities which Alloa fans have now become accustomed to. From his right-back berth Taggart's undoubted athleticism was clear to see, with his crossing ability with both feet another quality. Only a couple of weeks ago Spence was singing the praises of Taggart's guaranteed delivery from wide areas, with grateful recipient Greig naming Taggs in his all-time team during a Through the Turnstiles Podcast.

Taggart also got on the scoresheet three times during his first season at the club, with his first goal for the club still his finest. On an otherwise forgettable afternoon and defeat at Airdrie (infamously remembered for new manager Jim Goodwin scoring an own-goal before being sent-off!), Taggart's superbly taken 15 yard volley into the top corner gave Alloa some hope in the second half. After making a late run to meet Waters' deep cross, the technique Scott demonstrated (combining precision, power and accuracy) was nothing short of perfection.

Come the end of the season Taggart was ever-present throughout as the Wasps agonisingly missed out on promotion after losing out to Brechin in a sudden-death penalty shoot-out. The second half of the season saw Taggart in top form, with Alloa often using Taggs as an effective out-ball to switch play and then see Scott embark on marauding runs down the right-flank. **Defensively Scott was** part of a backline which kept 16 clean sheets, with a headed goal-line clearance away at East Fife being one instance of Scott playing a crucial



role in that fine record. Alas it wasn't a promotion winning season for Taggs, but he could feel proud of his efforts.

Unlike the team as a whole Taggart started the 2017/8 season in fine form, scoring in successive September games versus Ayr and Albion Rovers, Alloa's Autumn resurgence was thanks to a couple of tactical tweaks by Jim Goodwin. Garry Fleming's rejuvenation as a holding midfielder caught the eve most. but Taggart's switch into the centre of defence alongside Andy Graham was just as pivotal. The season changing 4-1 win over East Fife had Goodwin purring about Taggs, quipping that he'd had "a cigar out all day". Scott's calmness on the ball, good reading of the game and unheralded pace all combine to make him a reliable ball-playing central defender, whilst leaving as much of the aerial duels as possible to Graham! The pair have developed their partnership in the ensuing years, complementing each other's

games so well.

The January Joan signing of Jamie McCart enabled Scott to return to his preferred rightback role. February 2018 saw Taggart finally miss his first minutes in an Alloa shirt, after being withdrawn with a knock away at Ayr, after 7.263 consecutive minutes in the Wasps starting XI! A couple of months later Taggart's successive starting appearances record ended too, with a one-match suspension ending an amazing sequence of 92 successive starts for the Wasps. Scott slotted straight back into the team for the exhilarating conclusion to the season, culminating in a glorious return to The Rock to win promotion in the most dramatic of circumstances. In those memorable extra-time minutes against Dumbarton, Scott was still full of running whilst the Sons were floundering, with an extra incentive to put one over his former team/manager motivating Scott to eke out every last bit of energy to secure promotion.



It was a fitting end to a fine season for Taggart, who was deservedly named in the League One Team of the Season by his fellow professionals.

Scott's return to the Championship saw him spend the majority of the campaign in his preferred full-back role, where his trademark stamina was always in evidence. One telling contribution was a tremendously whipped cross down at Palmerston to set up Connor Shield's headed first goal for the Wasps. Come the business end of the season Taggart was back in the centre of defence alongside Andy Graham after an injury to loanee Sam Roscoe (who we welcome back to the Recs this afternoon with Ayr, where Scott coincidentally spent a loan spell back in 2010 from first club Hibernian). During that glorious late-season run of four successive wins,

which helped propel the Wasps up the table (a repeat this season would be nice!), Scott was a bedrock of Alloa's successes. The Wasps ultimately beat the drop under Jim Goodwin, with Taggs playing an integral part. Alongside his defensive comrades Neil Parry and Andy Graham, Taggart played every minute (4,140) of every game (46) that season.

Last season Scott was an essential part of Alloa's successful season under Peter Grant, Yet again Scott played every minute (3,240) of every game (36), with those appearances equally split between his natural right-back position and his increasingly familiar role in the centre of defence. Some particular highlights included a sensational slide-rule pass in the build up to Kevin O'Hara's winner versus Dundee United. a man of the match performance in the other home encounter against the Tangerines,

a first goal (another superbly taken volley away at Elgin) to end a 92 match and 2 year wait for his 7th in Alloa colours, countless blocks and last-ditch tackles to prevent certain goals (two at Dens Park were of the highest order), and finally, captaining the side to victory over Inverness in what became the final game of the season. More than anything, post-Christmas Taggs and Robbie Deas really stepped up to cover the absence of lionheart captain Andv Graham. Scott took on extra responsibility and revelled in the role, even developing his aerial prowess too. Taggs finished the season on 180 Alloa appearances, remarkably only missing 1 game in 4 seasons!

This season Scott has yet again been a standout performer for the team. The early season continued absence of Andy Graham meant Taggart retained the captain's armband and led the defence during the opening weeks of the season, with his performance on the opening day of the league season at Morton sensational, even in defeat. In November Scott was rested for the Betfred Cup Group Stage match against Stenhousemuir, ending a run of not missing a single minute of the previous 94 matches which equated to 8,490 consecutive minutes! That was the longest run of starting appearances by any Alloa player for at least 25 years (breaking Mark Cairns' 93 game run).

During the original lockdown Neil Parry affectionately remarked that Taggart was as fit as a butcher's pencil. The lead on that pencil broke for the first time away at Arbroath, with Scott missing almost two months of the season with injury. It was perhaps no coincidence that Taggart's return from injury in early February saw the Wasps win against Queen of the South, Scott has slotted straight back into the team, again showing his ever-increasing class at the heart of the Alloa defence. Still only 29, a recent new feature of Scott's repertoire has been taking attacking free-kicks, with Taggs denied goals against Dunfermline, Raith, Inverness and Dundee by fine goalkeeping hopefully the next one will finally nestle in the back of the net! Perhaps Scott's recent absence from the side only went to emphasise what an essential part of the team he is - his nonstop running, coolness on the ball, accuracy in short and long passing/ crossing and a steely determination and will-to-win means I for one hope that this 200 appearance milestone is only a stepping stone to many more games and heroics in an Alloa shirt for Scott in the future.



A FAN'S VIEW

We go into today's match against Avr United with six fixtures remaining and very little margin for error. In all likelihood Alloa are going to have to pick up 4 wins to have any hope of consolidating their position in the Championship. All is not lost, as we achieved a similar tally of wins with 7 matches remaining a couple of seasons back. The character and spirit of this group of players has never been in

question. Their strength in times of adversity have illustrated that they should never be written off.

When Dundee visited last Friday, I watched their team take to the field looking reasonably relaxed. Following their shock home defeat in the previous fixture against today's opponents Ayr, they were facing real adversity and some disarray amongst their fanbase. When

their manager James McPake made his way to the dugout, he certainly looked like a man feeling the pressure. It was a huge moment for him- his players had to react, or essentially his prospects looked very bleak. Either his players felt the pressure, or they gave him a reaction. Without wishing ill upon any opposition manager (in the majority of cases anyway), I had hoped for the former, but unfortunately the latter

occurred. Let's be honest, if you look at the talent within that Dundee team they really should be beating Alloa comfortably. The result was no huge shock, and Dundee's record at Alloa overall is very good in recent times. The visitors began strongly, but Alloa were achieving more success when their pressing became more aggressive as the half wore on. The opening goal was a real setback-going in level at

the break would have provided a great foundation for Alloa to build on. The lead allowed Dundee to sit in a bit more after the break and look for the likes of Paul McMullen to hit Alloa on the counter attack. They conserved vital energy levels and played out from the back when required. Their win was deserved and it was just one of those nights from an Alloa perspective.

Hindsight is a wonderful thing of course, and it's easy for supporters to say "the manager should have done this" after the fact. The previous week down at Palmerston Park I thought Ion Robertson was terrific deputising for Stevie Hetherington. He always found space to take a pass, kicking off creative passages of play and essentially pulling the strings. It's no real secret I am a huge Ion Robertson fan. But on the other hand. I could understand the decision to place Robbo back into defence for this game. This was a fixture where space was likely to be at a premium, and Hetherington is tailor made for this type of encounter. However. I think the performances of both Robertson and his deputy at right back Eden Lynch in that game at Palmerston should remain in the managers' thoughts in the final half dozen matches. Particularly

when we are going to perhaps be required to break down defences sitting a bit deeper and allowing space to drive forward.

It's undoubtedly been a tough season with the covid restrictions and the players would have been feeling that. Much of our playing squad have been together for quite some time, which is unique in the parttime environment of annual contract renewals. The strength in the unit has always been a huge factor in the team's achievements, and I'd hazard a guess that it's perhaps affected our team more than most. But all is not quite lost yet- we know the players will give it their best shot in the remaining games to consolidate in the

league for yet another season.

We will shortly look at votes for Player of the Year and Goal of the Season. There are still quite a few contenders for Player of the Year. although long spells out with injury have affected our general stalwarts such as Alan Trouten. Neil Parry, Scott Taggart and Andy Graham. My top contenders would probably be the ever consistent Liam Dick. and the flair and eye for goal of Kevin Cawley as he broke his appearance record for the club. The goal of the season voting is likely to be far more straightforward. Alan Troutens lob from the halfway line at Somerset Park the last time these clubs met would probably be fit to

win the award in any of the recent campaigns. At the turn of 2020 I compiled a list of Alloa's Goals of the Decade for the previous 10 years. I'd hazard a guess that Troutens goal would have made the top 10 of that list, maybe even top 5. It was one of those moments this season where celebration is immediately tinged with sadness - vou weren't there to witness it as we would have in "normal life" - Sadly, that day we ended up on the losing side. Let's hope it's different today.

spectators at East End Park, and a 1-1 draw meant no positional change for either club come full-time. Airdrie stayed third in spite of a 0-2 home defeat to St. Mirren, and as they trailed Falkirk by nine points, they clearly faced quite a task if they were to claim the sole promotion spot. Hamilton remained one place behind their Lanarkshire neighbours in fourth place, after they hammered hapless Brechin 9-1 at Douglas Park. This was City's seventh League game without success, and they remained firmly ensconced in bottom place, while in the "basement battle" at Cappielow, third-bottom Morton overcame second-bottom Clyde 2-0. Stranraer maintained their six-point advantage at the top of the Second Division. after a 1-1 draw at Alloa, for whom Steve Cadden was on target. Sec-

ond-placed Stenhousemuir were held 0-0 at home by lowly Albion Rovers, while thirdplaced Meadowbank also had to settle for a share of the spoils, after a 1-1 draw at Arbroath. Berwick stayed fourth after an emphatic 5-1 win at rock-bottom Cowdenbeath, while Alloa remained fifth. **English Premiership** leaders Manchester faced Aston Villa in the Coca-Cola Cup final the following day, and their lead at the top was now down to just three points, after second-placed Blackburn defeated bottom club Swindon 3-1 at home.

At the other end of the table. Morton's defeat virtually sealed their fate, while second-bottom Dunfermline's own worries continued after they lost their vital relegation

clash at Motherwell by 2-3. Falkirk remained third from bottom, while Motherwell's success game them some relief. though they remained in fourth-bottom spot. in the First Division. Hamilton Accies lead at the top was now down to three points, after they were held 1-1 at by Lanarkshire rivals Airdrie at Douglas Park, and second-placed Meadowbank defeated Forfar 3-0 at home, Raith remained third in spite of a shock 0-1 home defeat by struggling East Fife, while Airdrie retained fourth spot. David Hopkin has already made his first




