





NEWSDESK

To-day we welcome Celtic FC to the Indodrill Stadium, welcoming Ange Postecoglou, the players, officials and directors of Celtic FC. This will be the first time the clubs will have met in the competition. The Scottish Cup is the oldest competition in Scottish Association football, and the oldest trophy in the world that teams can still compete for. The tournament is steeped in history, and has created countless.

unforgettable moments throughout the years; the kind of moments that fans keep hold of and recount to friends and family at every opportunity.

The format for the competition this season for matches up to and including the Third Round, the last round, in games which ended in a draw a replay was required. However today we enter the Fourth Round where

there will be no replays for drawn matches from the Fourth Round onwards which will go straight to extra time and penalties.

If today's match was to be postponed the rescheduled date would be Tuesday 25th December at The Indodrill Stadium, Alloa.

Full crowds can now return to Scottish outdoor sporting events as from Monday 17th January, first minister

Nicola Sturgeon has confirmed. The Scottish government last month introduced Covid restrictions that capped attendances at events at 500. The first minister said the "Covid certification scheme will remain in place" but with "two important changes" for organisers of events. "Firstly, our guidance will now stipulate that the organisers of large events of 1.000 or more people should check the certification status of at

least 50% of attendees. rather than the current 20%, or at least 1,000 people - whichever figure is higher." Ms Sturgeon explained "And, second, from Monday the requirement to be 'fully vaccinated' for the purposes of Covid certification will include having a booster if the second dose was more than four months ago. "It will still be possible to gain admission to events and venues covered by the certification scheme by providing proof of a recent negative lateral flow test."

WELCOME BACK TO ALLOA, SCOTT BAIN

Yesterday marked the 10th anniversary of a pivotal win in Alloa's march towards the Third Division league title in the 2011/12 season. The Wasps travelled to Stair Park to face a Strangaer side who were a single point and single place behind Paul Hartley's side, who had edged to the top of the table for the first time that season on Boxing Day. The Wasps were expecting a stern test of their title credentials, but what ensued was one of the most complete away performances Alloa had produced in many a year. A rare right footed strike from Mark Docherty opened the scoring and teenage loanee Stevie May bagged a double, in-between Alloa's eventual goal of the season, an audacious 20 yard chip from Stevie Masterson. All in all it was a completely commanding performance from the rampant Wasps.

Fast forward a decade and a day and just one Alloa plaver remains on the club's books, record appearance maker Kevin Cawley. But another Alloa player from that game could be on the pitch this evening, with Celtic's Scott Bain making his first return to the Recs after leaving in 2014. Bain had little to do down at Stranraer a decade ago, but if he plays this evening hopefully he'll be far busier. Bain's three seasons

with the Wasps were highly successful and it is therefore fitting to chronicle some of those moments today.

Bain was actually Hartley's first ever signing as Alloa manager in June 2011, with the then 19 year old goalkeeper making the same journey from Pittodrie to Recreation Park as his new manager. Bain was let go from the granite city side by Craig Brown, who remarked that he might come to regret releasing Bain, but the ambitious young keeper was keen to gain regular first team football and immediately established himself as Alloa's number 1.

There were some character building early experiences for the Edinburgh born shot-stopper, with a big mistake for one of Morton's goals on his home debut and two red cards in his first nine matches for the club. First, Bain saw red for a professional foul at the Recs versus Clvde, who converted the resultant penalty to earn a 2-2 draw. Seven weeks later Bain was first booked for conceding a penalty up at Elgin, and then picked up another booking after mouthing off to the assistant referee following the

conversion of the penalty to put Elgin 4-0 up!

In-between those hiccups Bain had however shown enough promise to draw plaudits from his manager and fans alike. In particular, Hartley praised Scott for keeping the Wasps in the match with a series of fine stops to deny Stranraer in Alloa's eventual 3-2 win on the opening day of the league season. The Wasps supporters meanwhile gave Bain their thumbs up as "being a safe pair of hands". no doubt influenced by the indifferent form of previous custodians Stephen Robertson and Jamie Ewings a season earlier.

After a couple of games on the bench following his second suspension Bain was reintroduced to the starting eleven, beginning a run of 21 consecutive starts. During this spell the Wasps stormed to the Third Division title, with Scott getting some rave reviews along the way. A couple of memorable moments included a Boxing Day penalty save versus Elgin to avenge that earlier dismissal and a match-winning point-blank save from David Cox in a narrow 2-1 victory at Annan in March. Afterwards Hartley was fulsome in his praise "What a save it was from my goalkeeper - it was absolutely fantastic from Scott and it kept us ahead at a crucial time. It looked a goal all the way but I should expect that from Scott because I know his qualities. He's been doing it all season for me." Bain clearly enjoyed

that victory, high fiving some Wasps supporters behind the goal when the final whistle blew. Weeks earlier the keeper reflected on his season so far by enthusiastically stating "I'm loving my football at the moment and to be playing every week is just fantastic."

Come the end of the season Bain was celebrating with a Third Division Championship title medal and a place in the divisional Team of the Season (alongside teammates Michael Doyle, Ryan Harding, Rvan McCord, Kevin Cawley and Stevie May). Bain finished the season with a man-of-the-match performance on trophy presentation day versus Annan, a new contract for the following season and ten clean sheets in total. He was also named the Directors



Young Player of the Year and could feel highly satisfied with his decision to drop down the leagues to play games.

The step up to the Second Division did not frighten Bain or Alloa as a whole, with the Wasps going onto achieve successive promotions. Scott played every minute of the season. barring the final league match of the regular season when a host of players were rested in preparation for the end-of-season play-offs. His assured displays and fine shot-stopping earned him international recognition by being called up to the August and September 2012 Scotland Under 21 squads. Poor Scott had to book a couple of days off work from his building site labouring

job to join the squad!

During the season he was understandably busier than the previous campaign. but managed a greater number of shut-outs. with 14 achieved across the campaign. Being part of a more solid back-line helped, with new signings Daryll Meggatt and Jason Marr joining Michael Doyle and Ben Gordon to form a rock-solid back four, while the signing of midfield shield Stephen Simmons couldn't be underestimated either. However, Bain's clear communication, commanding presence and willingness to come for crosses all assisted in Alloa's improved defensive record.

The personal highlight of Bainy's season was perhaps a remarkable double stop away at Brechin in Ianuary, First Scott repelled David McKenna's penalty, before blocking the rebound as well, which had my fellow Wasp contributor Brian Roach signing Bain's praises. Come the business end of the season Bain was cool and calm in the play-off final matches against Dunfermline, although to be honest he was a virtual spectator in the clash at the Recs and the first 70 minutes at East End Park, After a Dunfermline goal made the score 3-1 on aggregate Bainy was alert to pull off a couple of fine late stops, which if they'd gone in would have certainly increased the pressure levels for the Wasps. Happily the Wasps played out time and Scott celebrated his second successive promotion. The scenes at the end of the game on the pitch and back at the Recs will still vividly be remembered by many. It is also pertinent that many players wait an entire career to achieve a promotion or title, so to achieve two in successive seasons at the age of 21 must have been highly pleasing for Bain.

Such was Scott's form and growing reputation it was no surprise that he almost made a move to a Premiership club over the summer of 2013. In the end it didn't happen and him re-signing for another campaign at the Recs was a real coup for the club. By this stage Bain quit his

iob as a labourer, to focus fully on performing his best for Alloa whilst still on a part-time deal. The Wasps free-flowing attacking football was adapted into a more robust counter-attacking style in the First Division, with Bain's reliable presence and non-stop heroics contributing to a sensational first half of the season for Alloa. The opening day 1-0 victory over Livingston saw Hartley describe Bain as the best young goalkeeper in the country. The strength of evidence for that claim grew in the subsequent weeks, with man of the match awards in successive home games versus Hamilton (won 1-0) and Falkirk (drew 0-0) adding to his reputation.

Up until the turn of the year Bain had remarkably kept 10 clean sheets from 18 matches in the second tier. In December Hartley again talked up his keeper "He makes a couple of outstanding saves in every game but we just expect that of him now. He is the best young goalkeeper in Scotland and I do not think he will be with us much longer. I'd be delighted if we got to the end of January and he was still an Alloa player but it is getting harder every transfer window to keep him."

The second-half of the season was tougher for Alloa, with Hartley departing and the Wasps finding points harder to achieve. Bain captained



the team for the first and only time on his 100th appearance for the club (in a game versus Cowdenbeath) and continued to perform with distinction in the Alloa goal. It however took a last day of the season 96th minute equaliser from QoS striker Bob McHugh at Cowdenbeath to drop the Blue Brazil into the play-off positions and move Alloa up to the promised land of an 8th place finish and safety. Alloa, who had lost that day at Falkirk, joyfully found out the news back in the dressing room, with Bain the first one back out onto the pitch to run to the remaining Alloa support to celebrate the Wasps staying up. Supporters and Bain himself will have known that he'd be moving on that summer, so it was a fitting end to his Alloa career, with his successes shared with the Wasps support a lasting memory. Successive promotions and safety from the drop in the second tier meant success was all Bainy knew at Alloa, with 40 clean sheets in 117 games an outstanding record.

Since departing the Recs for Dundee in 2014 (reuniting him with Paul Hartley) Bain's career has happily continued on an upward trajectory. After moving up the four senior leagues in successive seasons Bain soon established himself in

the Premiership with the Dees, performing regular heroics which earned him a call-up to the senior Scotland squad (without playing) a year after leaving Alloa. Things turned sour after a fallout with Neil McCann during the 2017/18 season at Dens Park, resulting in first a loan spell with Hibernian and then sensationally a similar loan with Celtic. Bain's debut was memorable, as it came in a 3-2 comeback win at Ibrox which sent Celtic nine points clear at the top of the table. Just four years earlier Bain was still playing parttime with the Wasps and had just made his 100th appearance for Alloa - from there to the biggest game in Scottish football! Bain's contribution was praised, which meant he shared the goalkeepers spot with Craig Gordon for the rest of the season and earned himself a permanent transfer on a four-year contract.

To put the icing on a whirlwind six-months Bain was then called back up to the national team squad and made his international debut at the famous Axteca Stadium versus Mexico in lune 2018. It was pleasing to see Scott keep a clean sheet in his 45 minute performance. which came exactly seven years to the week after he'd first signed for Alloa. In making his international bow Bain became the first player to

be capped by Scotland having previously played for Alloa on a permanent basis since Tommy Hutchison 45 years earlier. Bain has also played on the European stage whilst with Celtic, with one particularly memorable evening being an outstanding personal performance away at Valencia in February 2019, making a series of stunning reflex saves. Such was Bain's splendid form he gathered two further national caps the following month, in the infamous 3-0 defeat in Kazakhstan and 2-0 victory three days later in San Marino.

It's also heart-warming that Bain evidently still holds some affection for Alloa. For example, on the day Celtic clinched an eighth successive title on 4th May 2019, Bain took a

moment away from celebrating to pass on his congratulations via social media to the Wasps, who on the same day defied the odds to avoid relegation from the Championship thanks to a draw at Avr. It wasn't something Scott needed to do, but perhaps it struck a chord with Bain after his last-day survival joy five years earlier for Alloa at Falkirk? In the past couple of seasons Bain has been used more sparingly for Celtic, with this season him being largely on the bench behind first-choice loe Hart. Should he get the nod to play this evening he will deservedly receive an appreciative warm welcome back to the Recs from Alloa supporters, having served the club so well whilst a Wasp!

MESMERISING WASPS IN PREMIER POSITION

A welcome break from the league with the January Scottish Cup visit to Alloa of one of the grand old names of Scottish football - and past winners of the famous trophy to boot. That was the scenario for the Wasps 100 years ago as St Bernard's arrived in town for a mouth-watering first round tie. Alloa went into the match in fine fettle, unbeaten in 9 games and sitting proudly at the top of the table in their maiden season in the Scottish League. For the first

time too, there was the prospect of automatic promotion for the Second Division champions. Wee County folk were starting to believe that the local Wasps, a Central League club just months before, could maintain their form and claim a place in the top flight alongside the giants of the national game. That belief had been reinforced the week before the St Bernard's tie when Vale of Leven had visited Alloa on league business. The Vale too were a club with a fine pedigree

- three time winners of the Scottish Cup in the late 1870's. On the latter two occasions the Vale had gone on to enjoy comfortable victories over FA Cup winners The Wanderers and Old Ftonians in the contest which some would label a few years later as 'The Championship of the World'. The Vale of Leven side which arrived in Alloa in January 1922 weren't quite world champions, but they were a solid combination who had been steadily climbing the Second Division. A

win would put the Vale within 6 points of Alloa and firmly establish the Alexandria men as championship contenders.

The Wasps were quick to extinguish any such hopes. There was just a minute on the clock when Dunn fired Alloa ahead and that set the tone for the rest of the half, the Sunday Post reporting that the Vale defence was "mesmerised" by the home attack. Wilie Crilley – who else – was at the heart of it all and two goals from the pint


sized attacker had Alloa 3-0 up at the break. Crilley completed his hat-trick in the second period - his seventh treble of the season - in another display which showed just why he would end up a few months later in the colours of today's opponents Celtic. Indeed, Crilley was already training at Celtic Park, which was after all just a mazy run from the streets where he had grown up, and the press would soon report that he couldn't deny his affection for the Parkhead men. But not vet. For now Crilley was still very much the darling of the Wee County. The Post concluded that this was a "wonderful display of football" that proved that Alloa were "the" team of the Second Division, and wondered just how far could they go in the cup as well.

St Bernard's would not be easy opposition. The Stockbridge Saints were one of only two sides to have defeated Alloa in the league and a 2-0 win over a faltering East Fife was the perfect preparation for the cup tie. A crowd of 4.500 was inside the Recs as the teams took to the field and they saw a new name in the Alloa line-up - if not altogether a new face. An exciting wide player going under the name of McDougall had featured in Alloa's last two games, the press assuming that this was Alva born former Millwall winger Duncan Mc-Dougall, who had signed for Alloa a few months earlier. But it turned out that the elusive attacker was actually Cochrane of Shawfield Juniors, playing under an assumed name. Alloa could have listed Cochrane as a trialist, but with the papers describing the inside left as "promising and highly sought after", this can only have been a ruse to throw other interested parties off

the scent. It worked and Cochrane was now officially a Wasp. The unfortunate McDougall on the other hand, his identity used as a ploy to sign another player in his own position, was promptly placed on the transfer list. It wasn't going to work out for this Alva man at Alloa.

Cochrane was quick to show just why Alloa had been so keen to get him. With 20 minutes played he combined with Crilley before releasing Stirling down the flank. The veteran's cross was met by Ouinn and it was 1-0 Alloa. Back came St Bernard's and a drive from Cox struck the upright with Caldwell beaten. Alloa were happy enough to reach the interval a goal ahead. The second half followed a similar pattern but gradually Alloa took control and Crilley turned home the second goal following a goalmouth scramble. Soon enough it was

three, Crilley embarking on one of his trademark solo runs before finding Stirling whose cross was finished to the net by Cochrane. Donachie pulled one back for the Edinburgh men but it finished 3-1 Alloa, the Sunday Post noting that "for once Crilley was not the man in the attack -Cochrane easily claiming premier position". The Wasps supporters headed back into town most satisfied with their new signing and safe in the knowledge that they would go into February top of the table and safely into the next round of the cup. Today's opponents Celtic were through too, McFarlane (2), McInally and McLean on target in a 4-0 win over Montrose in front of 10,000 fans. Next up for the Wasps was a league clash with Stenhousemuir - and some most unwelcome transfer rumours about Crilley. More in the next edition of The Wasp

A FAN'S VIEW

Today is an occasion I'm sure all connected to the club have been looking forward to ever since the cup draw was made a couple of months ago. Scottish Government restrictions to crowd numbers were thankfully lifted last week, which guarantees a full house and a great atmosphere- as well as a nice little revenue injection for the club. Celtic make their first visit to the ground competitively for almost 40 years- since the old League Cup sections back in season 1982/83. Celtic are also the last of Scottish footballs larger clubs to visit in the more modern era. We've hosted Hearts, Hibs. Rangers, Dundee United. and even Aberdeen iust prior to Paul Hartley joining the club as manager back in 2011. And with the exceptions of the Dons. Alloa have beaten them all here. A few years ago, Alloa made the trip to Celtic Park (again for the first time since 1982) to face the Celtic team who would go onto become **Brendan Rodgers** domestic "invincibles" that season. And the Wasps succumbed only to 2 very late goals by lames Forrest and Moussa Dembele. I remember being at the game and seeing the clock run down, thinking extra time was a real possibility. There was also the additional factor of the failure to send

off Craig Gordon for a first half karate kick on Alloa striker Greig Spence outside the area. It's doubtful that the referee showing some backbone with his card colour would have reversed the outcome of that game, but regardless Alloa gave a really good Celtic team a proper contest- as good a game as anyone did that season.

I think the timing of this game is also favourable, in terms of a welcome breather from the league campaign. The results of the last 2 league games haven't been bad at all- draws against Montrose away then Queens Park last weekend here. But obviously it's victories Alloa need at this stage to pull away from the relegation positions. After a fairly subdued opening half across the piece against Queens last week, Connor Smith jump started the contest 5 minutes before the break with a really lovely curling effort bouncing in off the woodwork. This put the onus onto Alloa to come out all guns blazing second half. And for 15 minutes they were excellent, creating a number of chances before Kevin Cawley was in the right place to equalise from close range. Alloa looked likely to remain on the front foot and push on for more goals, but they became a bit

bogged down and it all petered out a bit. I don't think Alloa looked in any real danger of losing the game, but it will be a source of slight frustration that they couldn't really sustain that bright spell for a more prolonged period. It was similar to the Montrose game the previous week, where Alloa were excellent at times but just couldn't keep the momentum for long enough to fully dominate their opponents sufficiently enough to guarantee the 3 points. When Alloa resume their league campaign next week they face 2 pretty critical matches on the road against Clyde followed by Peterhead. These games are certainly proverbial "6 pointers" and will be pivotal fixtures.

But this weekend Alloa can enjoy the occasion and hopefully put on a strong showing in front of the full house and the TV audience. The pressure is obviously off tonight, and whilst I wouldn't expect too much deviation structurally, I'd naturally expect the team to sit in a deeper position and ensure we have bodies behind the ball protecting the back 4. At the time of writing, Euan Henderson's position at the club was still in the balance. He of course played against Bonnyrigg Rose in the previous round, so is eligible if his loan spell is extended. However, regardless of whether Henderson returns (and he would be a huge void to fill in the team going forward) I suspect Conor Sammon will start up top as sole striker. He was really effective there at Links Park a fortnight ago, and his experience will be a vital asset in games such as these. The effort the big man puts in is never

in question, and position wise he tends to be in the right place. I doubt Celtic's centre backs will relish coming up against him and he'll certainly give them a hard time if selected today. For the opposition, it's always great to see good players live and in the flesh on the Alloa pitch. I think it's doubtful that Jota and Kyogo will be risked for the game as they recover from hamstring injuries- unfortunately they would probably be the pair who would be the most enjoyable to watch from close quarters with both looking Regardless, it will be interesting to see new signings Hatate, Maeda and Ideguchi should any play a part in the game. Add to that class which should hopefully make this a memorable night. I really like the Celtic manager and his straight shooting approach to interviews in

a team who take risks but are also exciting to watch. Finally, as the match programme becomes available online this season a couple of days before the fixture. If you are reading this on the Thursday or Friday I was a guest on the Celtic podcast "Homebhoys" hosted by Scott McCorry, where I gave him the lowdown on Alloa for a laid back 45-minute chat. Obviously Alloa are massive underdogs tonight, but as stated earlier Alloa have been in this situation before against the big guns and prevailed. That particular outcome would be out of this world, but regardless of the final result hopefully tonight is a memorable occasion that all attending supporters enjoy.



"The Wasps" had been handed the sell out Celtic tie after defeating Highland League side Fraserburgh in the previous round 4-2 at Recreation Park. A

crowd of around 15.000 packed into the ground and eagerly awaited the kick-off. Alloa manager Webber Lees was dealt a blow prior to kick-off when their top goalscorer George Henderson was ruled out, but did include ex Celtic plaver Thomas Kiernan who had scored 16 goals under limmy McGrory at Parkhead during Season 1946/47, Celtic themselves had Charlie Tully & John Higgins unavailable

Alloa Athletic were huge underdogs going into the game and had opted to play Jimmy Wishart at centre forward instead of defence and his presence was giving the Celtic defence an unexpected problem with "The Wasps" taking the game to their esteemed opponents. Hesitancy in the Celtic defence was near to be costly as Stein was again troubled by Wishart but the Glasgow team survived for now. In 25 minutes "The Wasps" did take the lead and it was certainly not a surprise on the way the pressure had been mounting on the Celtic defence where Bonnar



had been the busier keeper, after a corner from the right had been partially cleared the ball broke to Billy lynch who hit a low grounder past the Celtic keeper to open the scoring. This gave Celtic a jolt and there was more urgency now, Bobby Collins driving deeper into the Alloa half. The home side still looked in control but it was important to hold out until half-time then disaster struck just prior to the half-time whistle, when referee I.A. Bissett (Edinburgh) pointed to the spot after Neilly Mochan was deemed to have been brought down in the box. Michael Haughney scored with the penalty to draw the sides level just as they left the pitch for half-time.

"The Wasps" had the first attempt on goal in the second half, but the ex Celtic player, Thomas Kiernan saw his shot go over the bar. Ten minutes into the second half the visitors took the lead, Jimmy Walsh putting Celtic ahead for the first time. But back came Alloa who never looked out of the game and four minutes later it was 2-2 when Thomas Kiernan deflected a Billy Lynch corner past Bonnar in the Celtic goal.

Celtic had another scare when Jock Stein had to go off with no substitutes available before being introduced in 1963, however he did return and soldiered on. As the time ran down it was looking as if this tie would go to a replay that is before Celtic hit back with a killer punch to the valiant Alloa side. The Celtic goal scored by Bertie Peacock came out of the blue putting them 3-2 ahead and with Alloa pushing everything into attack to try and gain a draw limmy Walsh scored his second goal of the game to kill the

Sadly "The Wasps" were to finish second bottom of the "B" Division only above Brechin City while Celtic progressed to the Scottish Cup final were they faced Clyde at Hampden. The first game ended 1-1 and unfortunately for Celtic Clyde won the replay 1-0 thanks to a Tommy Ring winning goal.

Today sees the fifth meeting between the two clubs in the Scottish Cup with Celtic winning each of the previous games.



This afternoon we welcome Premiership giants, Celtic, to the Indodrill for the Scottish Cup fourth round tie. THE BOSS – ANGE POSTECOGLOU

Celtic made their move to replace Neil Lennon in the summer with the eye-catching appointment of Ange Postecoglou. The Greekborn defender was brought up and plied his trade in Australia with South Melbourne and his National side. It was at this side where he began his managerial career and went onto win NSL Premiership and Championship titles in the nineties. Postecoglou would go onto manage Brisbane Roar and Melbourne Victory where his success was recognised with his appointment with the Australia National Team. He led the team to the 2014

World Cup where they were drawn alongside Spain, Netherlands and Chile. Despite dropping out the competition, the side were commended for their performances and were later rewarded with a win in the 2015 AFC Asian Cup. 2017 saw Postecoglou move to Yokohama F. Marinos in Japan where he guided the team to their first J. League title in fifteen vears, becoming the first Aussie to win a lapanese title. This summer was the switch to Glasgow and again, he became the first Australian to manage in this country. Despite a bumpy start in Europe and on the opening day against Hearts, his attractive and intense style of football has found its feet as his side become a force to be reckoned with. Already one trophy in the cabinet, his new signings and style of play continue to catch the eye of many.

When Scott Brown left Parkhead, the captainancy was a big position to fill. The natural progression was what Celtic





went for by appointing Scotland midfielder Callum McGregor. The 28-year old has been at the club his whole life beginning it back in 2001 in the youth system. Influenced by Tommy Burns, McGregor was always highly rated by the coaches at Parkhead. however, it was a loan in 2013 to Notts County where he found his feet at a senior level. He returned in 2014 and a goal on his Celtic debut away to KR Reykjavik was a sign of success to come for McGregor. Over three-hundred appearances, over fifty goals and fourteen trophies later he was awarded the captain's armband. Last year saw more glory with him scoring Scotland's only goal at the European Championships against Croatia and signing a bumper fiveyear deal at Celtic Park. An integral part of Postecoglou's side, McGregor offers a steady and reliable head in the middle of the park.

NEW BOY -DAIZEN MAEDA

Postecoglou's transfer policy this month has raised a few evebrows as Daizen Maeda is one of three Japanese players to make the switch to Glasgow. The forward spent time with Postecoglou at Yokohama F. Marinos and has caught the attention of many with his performances in the | League. Last season he was named in the I. League Best XI at the end of the season and was also top goalscorer in the league

with twenty-three strikes. Two caps to his name for Japan also adds to an impressive footballing CV. This will be his second stint in Europe after a brief spell in Portugal with C.S. Martimo. Maeda signed for Celtic alongside Reo Hatate and Yosuke Ideguchi on the first day of the window. The deal is initially a loan, however, has the obligation to buy in the summer. Postecoglou and the Celtic fans will be hoping that he can produce similar stats to fellow countryman, Kyogo, who has set the league on fire so far.

ONE TO WATCH -KYOGO FURUHASHI

The Celtic squad is glittered with talent but none more so than the man previously mentioned, Kyogo Furuhashi. Another one of Poste-

coglou's lapanese recruits in the summer, Kyogo has brought a breath of fresh air to Scotland with his scintillating performances so far. Having signed from Vissel Kobe in the summer for just under five million, Kyogo immediately hit the ground running with a goal on his first start against Jabloncec. Three days later he scored his first league goals with a hat-trick against at Dundee. That has been a familiar story for the rest of the season so far, with despite injuries, Kyogo has hit sixteen goals for the club and is the top goalscorer. These goals included a glorious double at Hampden in the League Cup Final to secure a 2-1 victory against Hibernian. Questions mark remain over his fitness after a return for injury but no

doubt Postecoglou will be desperate to get him back fully fit and firing for the second half of the season.

THE CONNECTION

There aren't many Alloa connections in the current Celtic ranks to speak about. However, the main one would be goalkeeper Scott Bain making his return to the Indodrill. Bain's career has gone from strength to strength since he left Alloa back in 2014 for Dundee with Scotland caps and several trophies under his belt. 'Bainy' was part of a historic Alloa side from 2011 to 2014 that

enjoyed back-to-back promotions and a heroic survival season in the Championship, Regarded as a modern-day great by Alloa fans, he goes down as one of the best Alloa stoppers in history. There are a few Alloa players who began their career in the Celtic youth ranks but didn't quite make the grade at Parkhead. Kevin Cawley is one who impressed in the youth teams between 2005 and 2009. More recently though, Daniel Church was part of successful Celtic reserve sides before making a move in the search of first-team football. We must also

Willie Crilley.

PREVIOUS MEETINGS

There aren't many times that these clubs meet so the occasion is a special one. The last time was back in 2016 when Jack Ross took his unbeaten Alloa side to Celtic Park. It took the Champions till the eighty-third minute to break the deadlock after heroics from Neil Parry. Andy Graham and co. lames Forrest opened the scoring that night before Moussa Dembele made it two with minutes left on the clock. Alloa fans can dream 'what if' if Celtic goalkeeper Craig Gordon had seen an early red for a high-kick on Greig Spence. Celtic would go onto win an Invincible Treble that year showing their dominance. The last time the sides met in the Scottish Cup was when Celtic came away with a much more convincing 5-0 win in 2002 when the tie was moved to Brockville Park, Falkirk as Recreation Park was deemed unfit. Celtic booked their place in the next round with goals from Balde, Weighorst, Maloney, Petta and Sylla. This is Celtic's first visit to the Indodrill Stadium.

KYOGO FURUHASHI

THE MAN WHO WAS LED TO THE TOP LEVEL BY INJESTA AND VII I A

Furuhashi's breathtaking performances in the first half of the season must have been very surprising to people in Scotland. You may be even more surprised to hear that he was an anonymous player, even in Japan, until a few years ago.

He went to the same high school as Liverpool's Takumi Minamino. Minamino was a promising youth national team player, and he also played at the professional level while still in high school. On the other hand, Furuhashi was just a member of his high school's football club.

He continued to play football in university. He attended training sessions at several professional clubs, but did not receive any offers. He had almost given up on becoming a professional footballer.

At the last minute, he received an offer from FC Gifu, in the second division of the J-League and finally achieved his dream.

FC Gifu was one of the lower-ranked clubs in the division. However, Furuhashi continued to show his ability. He got a regular position from the opening game and he played in 68 games and scored 18 goals in his first year and a half with FC Gifu. In the summer of 2018, he won a transfer to Vissel Kobe in the first division.

Vissel Kobe is a club sponsored by Rakuten, a major internet shopping company in Japan that also sponsors FC Barcelona. When Furuhashi moved to Kobe, the club had some big names like Andres lniesta, David Villa and Lukas Podolski. The encounter with these players would change his career.

In training, Furu-



hashi learnt the world class skills of Villa. He improved his skills as a striker. During the game, Iniesta took advantage of his skills with accurate passes. Furuhashi scored 42 goals in three years, 10 of which came from assists from Iniesta. Playing alongside world class players, he grew in confidence.

In 2019, he was selected for the national team for the first time. He played with Minamino, who was out of his league in his high school days.

He moved to Celtic last summer. He has made 26 appearances and scored 16 goals, already becoming an indispensable part of the team. We are looking forward to seeing how Furuhashi develops in Glasgow.

WINTER NEWCOM-ERS: THREE SAMURAIS

Celtic coach Ange Postecoglou, convinced of the quality of Japanese players after the great success of Furuhashi, welcomed three new samurais to the Hoops this winter. Unlike Furuhashi, Daizen Maeda, Yosuke Ideguchi and Reo Hatate have all represented the youth national teams and have shown great promise at a young age.

Described as a bullet train, **Daizen Maeda** is a fast attacker who can run 50 metres in 5.8 seconds.

As well as his speed, he is notable for the number of sprints per game. Running the length and breadth of the pitch in such a way that you would imagine the Hoops had 12 players.

In 2021, he played 36 games, scoring 22 goals at Yokohama F.Marinos and becoming the top scorer of Japan. He also played in the Olympic Games held in Tokyo.

He worked with Ange Postecoglou at Yokohama. With the influence of Ange, Maeda began to score regularly for the first time in his career. After partnering up again, it won't be long before he is fit for the team.

Yosuke Ideguchi is a central midfielder known for his ability to

win the ball. He is also a threat in attack when the opportunity arises.

He has been selected for the national under-category team since he was 15 years old. He is also a precocious player at club level, making his first team debut for Gamba Osaka at the age of 17. In 2017, he scored the goal that led Japan to the World Cup in Russia. However, he experienced a major setback.

He moved to Leeds United in 2018. After failing to get a work permit, he was sent out on loan to play in Spain and Germany.

Both were less than successful and he missed out on a place in Japan's World Cup squad.

He returned to Osaka and in the last three years has been getting back on track. Now he's back in Scotland for a second chance at European football.

Reo Hatate is an athletic utility player. He originally played as a striker before reaching the professional ranks.

He won the Universiade twice and scored a hat-trick in the Toulon International for the U22 national team.

However, after he joined Kawasaki Frontale, who had a strong forward line, Hatate was converted to left back to give him more opportunities. The conversion was a great success and he was selected for the Japanese Olympic team at left back.

He has only been playing at left back for a short time and still has a lot to improve defensively, but his dynamic attacking play will add depth to Celtic's attack. It will be interesting to see which position Ange Postecoglou chooses to use him in

Today, of course, I would like to support Alloa Athletic as a sponsor. However, as a Japanese, I would be delighted if as many as possible of the four Japanese players could play at Indodrill Stadium.


