I think it was a dogged performance, we've played a bit better [on other occasions] but I know Montrose are a good team. I've had time since their last game with Clyde with our game against Falkirk being off trying to plan the game how we're going to play because they are a really good team, when I saw them last season and this I knew they would be really difficult - and it was! - in the end Rodden made the difference.

Football can be a game of two halves teams tire as the game goes on, mistakes get made through that tiredness but we're a fit team especially for a part time team. We're scoring a lot of really late goals and I knew they would keep going to the end so I said I wanted them to play forward a wee bit quicker and get runners up beside the strikers faster.

We're a big team and we've used set pieces to our advantage. It's something we work hard on. The cross and delivery, the movement and it's great to get another goal from it. It shows that if you put the work and the effort in and practice you'll get the goals which we've got a few from now.

The boys know I've had this conversation with them - If we're drawing with 10-15 minutes to go. We're going for the win. I'm not interested in sitting back at 1-1. I'd rather go out and win the games. If we lose a goal, so be it. Three points is massive and today it's a massive result for us.

We're only seven games in and we'll use Airdrieonians on Friday to give one or two of the boys game time. It's not one we're going to treat lightly though. We want to win every game. Airdrie are a very good team, we know that it'll be a very difficult game.

Bradley Rodden's attitude is exactly what I want. I said it to the boys in the dressing room. He's scored two goals, set two up and he's found himself on the bench. He doesn't go in the huff. Doesn't moan about it but comes off the bench and grabs himself a good goal. That's exactly the attitude that I want to see from every player. There's competition for places now and we're getting boys back to make the full squad available.

The boys deserve to enjoy themselves because they've had a great result in a tough game.

It's just cramp with Scougall today - he covers a lot of ground and has a lot of the ball - He's only got wee legs! as I keep telling him.

He's an important player and one of the best in the division in my opinion but he's okay.

We'll start planning for Alrdrie from tonight [Saturday] - that's how it is being in charge of a football team. You enjoy yourself in the summer. That's the way I've always done it.

ALLOA'S U21 CONNECTIONS

If you're reading this under the lights at the Recs this evening, a little bit of history might have been created vesterday. Jay Hogarth may have joined a select group of players to have won an international under-21 cap whilst playing for the Wasps. The on-loan Alloa goalkeeper's call-up to the double header of friendlies with Northern Ireland is a fitting reward for his promising early season form for the Wasps. Should the 19-year-old get the nod to play from

manager Scot Gemmill, in either the Belfast game yesterday or the upcoming match in Paisley on Sunday, he would become just the third player I am aware of to win national U21 honours whilst playing for Alloa.

The other two examples were both on loan at the Recs like Hogarth is. Most recently Michael Duffy played six times for Northern Ireland U21s whilst on loan from Celtic at Alloa in the 2015/16 season. Duffy missed Alloa's early season 2-0 victory at Dumbarton as he was playing for Northern Ireland's U21 against, ironically, Scotland! Later in the season Duffy was fortunate to miss Alloa's 5-0 thrashing by Falkirk as he was amidst an international double header against France (Duffy was kept out by now Bayern Munich and France defender Beniamin Pavard that night in a 1-0 defeat) and Ukraine.

The only other player I've tracked down to ever win U21 national honours whilst playing for the Wasps was Derek Soutar. During Soutar's second spell on loan at the Recs in 2003 he also played three times for Scotland U21's. The then Dundee keeper had broken through into the national U21 team after a successful promotion winning season with the Wasps in 2001/02. When he rejoined Terry Christie's Alloa side on loan in January 2003 he performed superbly for the Wasps (resulting in a certain Myles Hogarth leaving the Wasps for regular game-time at Stirling Albion), with the Wasps losing two games at the end of March when Soutar was absent playing for the national side.

There is a slight caveat that neither Duffy or Soutar were permanent Alloa players at the time of winning their caps. The Wasps have come close to having a fully bona fide U21 internationalist in their ranks on a couple of occasions. but alas it hasn't happened to date. First, during the 1999-2000 season there were rumours that Martin Cameron would be rewarded for his Alloa goalscoring heroics with a call-up to the national U21 squad. It was understood that it was a straight choice between 'The Butcher' and Clyde's young starlet Brian 'Carrots' Carrigan. Carrots won the battle, making a substitute appearance for Scotland U21 versus The Netherlands in April 2000, weeks before Clyde pipped Alloa to the Second Division title and Carrigan also scooped the PFA Second Division Player of the Year ahead of Cameron too. Carrigan went onto play for the Wasps almost a decade later, with both players careers never really reaching the true heights their early potential suggested.

In 2012 Scott Bain was an unused substitute three times with Billy Stark's Scotland U21 team. Bain had just won the Third Division title the previous season and started life in the Second Division well, with his manager Paul Hartley regularly describing him as the best young keeper in the country. That probably helped Bain's call-up, where he sat on the bench throughout an August friendly defeat to Belgium and the September qualifiers versus Luxembourg and Austria. Current QPR bench-sitter Jordan Archer and Mark Ridgers (now the long-time stopper at Inverness CT) kept Bain on the bench, with it notable that neither of those goalkeepers have gone onto win full international honours, unlike the three caps Bain has picked up.

There are however countless players who have played for the Wasps having previously played international U21 football. Of the current squad Stefan Scougall and Adam King both have two Scotland U21 caps, while Conor Sammon won three caps for the Republic of Ireland back in 2007 (all from the bench). A selection of present-day Alloa players have enjoyed international recognition at other age groups too, with Daniel Church having Scotland U16, U17 & U19 caps and Murray

Miller having Scotland U16 & U17 caps before changing his allegiances to the country of his birth Australia, with whom he has U17 caps. New Alloa strikers Luke Donnelly and Kieran Offord have both played for Scotland U17s, with Offord currently with the U19 squad playing in the Slovenia Nations Cup (games are scheduled for last Wednesday. today and next Tuesday) hoping to add to the two appearances he made at that level last season. Donnelly also played for Scotland at U15 and U16 level as he came through the Celtic youth set-up. Last but certainly not least, George Stanger of course has experience with New Zealand U20s (including keeping out Erling Haaland at the U20 World Cup) and the U23 team at the delayed Tokyo Olympics last year, as already highlighted in the matchday programme this season.

Looking back in the record books, the list of Scotland U21 players who later went onto play for Alloa (or very occasionally played for the Wasps before going onto U21 honours) is considerable and includes some surprising names given the quality of their subsequent Alloa careers! The goalkeepers range from Andv McNeil and Dave McEwan to Colin Stewart* (* an Alloa loan signing) and Jamie MacDonald*. The list of defenders with Scotland U21 caps comprises Raymond Sharp, Andv Seaton, Kevin McHattie*, Jason Marr, Scott McKenna*, Jamie Mc-Cart* and most recently Robbie Deas*. The number of midfielders with Scotland U21/Alloa connections includes Paul Sheerin, Max Christie, Grant Johnson, Derek Ferguson, Ian Murray*, Kieran McAnespie, Darren Young,



Stephen Simmons. Burton O'Brien, Liam Burt*, Jake Hastie*, and Scott Banks*. Moving onto the forwards, the Alloa connections are Andy Walker, Scott Crabbe, Brian Carrigan, Bryan Prunty, Stevie May*, Calum Elliot, Declan McManus* and Derek Riordan. Out of all those players so far only six have gone onto play for the full national team, with only current Nottingham Forest defender Scott McKenna gaining double figures in caps (Ferguson, Murray, Walker, May and Riordan were the others).

It would also be remiss of me not to reference the players who have played for other U21 international sides before playing for the Wasps. This is a select list, led by Northern Ireland duo Mikey McGowan and Andy Kirk. Further south in the Republic of Ireland

current Aberdeen manager lim Goodwin won six U21 caps and even scored a goal! Across the Irish Sea in Wales the Alloa connection is loanee left-back James Bloom. Finally, the most exotic U21 international connection with Alloa is Estonia's Mikk Reintam, who won 12 U21 caps in 2011-12. Neither Mikk nor any Alloa supporter would have thought that three years later he'd be in the Recs dressing room listening to team-talks by then Alloa manager Danny Lennon, but that's football for you! Out of that half dozen players the strike-rate of those who went onto get full international recognition is far higher than the Scottish contingent, at 50% with Kirk. Goodwin and Reintam all stepping up to the senior teams.

Returning to Hogarth though, his competition for minutes in the U21 team this week are voungsters on the books of Manchester City and Lincoln City respectfully. First is Ciaran Slicker, a 20 year old keeper who already has four U21 caps, who is presently on loan at Rochdale from parent club Manchester City. Slicker has been on the bench at the Spotland Stadium this season (aside from the cup games which he's started), with Rochdale rock-bottom of League Two (the only side keeping Hartlepool, managed by Paul Hartley until his sacking last Sunday, off the basement). The other keeper in the squad is Sam Long, a 19 year old shotstopper currently on loan at National League North side Boston United from Lincoln City. Long doesn't have any previous U21 caps to date, but was previously call-up to the squad in March. Coincidentally both Slicker and Long are English born

players and, based on my research (given I'd never heard of some of players in the squad), there are actually eight English born players in the current U21 squad, demonstrating Scotland are utilising the birthplace of parents and grandparents rules to the full.

Whilst Hogarth can reasonably be considered the least experienced of the three keepers at U21 level, with this being his first call-up at this level, he has steadily risen through the age groups by amassing four U16 caps, 2 games with the U17's and another four at U19 level. Furthermore, the fact he is playing regular football at a decent League One standard may count in his favour too. If lavs has/does won/win a cap it will mark another milestone in his highly promising early career and be a proud moment for the Wasps too.

A RETURNING HERO AND SHEER GRIT

There was a buzz of anticipation among Wee County folk as they made their way towards the Recs for a midweek testimonial 100 years ago. The man rewarded with a benefit match against Hearts was popular defender Bobby Orrock. The former Scotland cap had arrived at the Central League Wasps back in 1919 at the age of 34. Orrock had guickly disproved any suggestions that he was winding down his career in Clackmannanshire. He had starred in

the Wasps' Scottish Cup exploits of 1921 and his towering performances at the back had then been key to Alloa's rise from non-league football to the First Division. Already by September 1922 he had caught the eve at Brockville and Love Street. two of his former stamping grounds, with local fans noting that Orrock was playing as well as ever despite his advancing years. Bobby was a man about town in Alloa too. owner of a billiards hall on Clackmannan

Road and a fine golfer as well. A healthy crowd was guaranteed for his testimonial. But Orrock wasn't the main attraction at his benefit, nor indeed were guest players Simpson and McNair who had been drafted in the for the night. The man everyone wanted to see was Willie Crilley, the little striker who had rattled in over 50 goals for Alloa in 1921/22 before signing for Celtic. Crilley was due back at the Recs for a guest appearance to boost the gate for the


testimonial.

And as the teams prepared for kickoff on Tuesday 19th September 1922, Alloa secretary Mr Saunders made an announcement that overshadowed Bobby Orrock's big night and anything else that was happening in the Wee County: Alloa had re-signed Willie Crillev! Celtic might have been the club closest to Crilley's heart, but it was reported that the Parkhead directors had guickly concluded that the "fierce tackling

associated with most of their matches" did not suit the pint sized hitman. The Alloa board were contacted for first refusal and a deal hastily agreed. The details were then put to the man himself on board a train as he travelled to the Orrock testimonial. It was said to be the "surprise of his life...he was in complete ignorance that negotiations were going on for his transfer", with Mr Saunders telling the press "that the little fellow's face was a remarkable study in astonishment". But by the time the train rolled into Alloa terms had been agreed and the deal was signed before he took to the field. Crillev. it was said, wanted to be at a club where he would play every week. Perhaps the wee man also just wanted to be loved, and there was nowhere else where his talents were so appreciated as in the Wee County, with the Sunday Post noting that he had been "supremely happy" at Alloa previously. The fact that the Wasps had actually offered him more money than Celtic that summer might have helped too. The Alloa supporters who "were simply clamouring for the return of Crilley" gave him a mighty reception as he ran on for the testimonial. The game itself eventually

saw Hearts winning 2-0 with Crilley firing a penalty high over the bar, but Bobby Orrock picked up a nice bonus from a crowd of 3000, and more importantly "the midget centre" was back home.

So to Broomfield the following Saturday and a contest against Airdrie. Our visitors tonight had made a terrific start back in 1922 and were sitting top of the First Division as they greeted Alloa. With a special train running 1000 travelling fans were expected to see Crillev back in the black and gold. The wee man started and his presence was said to have inspired the team. Jock Stirling's goal after fine work from Craig giving Alloa a half-time lead that they just about deserved. The second half saw an Airdrie bombardment with Crilley limping off injured. Mc-Dougall of Airdrie drove two efforts narrowly over and a Dovle header came back off the bar



but Alloa held on. with Headrick and McGregor outstanding in defence. As the Diamonds pushed up in numbers late on Cochrane burst away for a fine solo goal and Alloa had a priceless 2-0 victory won by "sheer grit". "Alloa at it again" reported the Evening News, reporting that the win had "staggered" Airdrie, who dropped to second with Alloa up to 12th. The aggrieved Broomfield faithful took

out their frustration on the match official, the Evening News reporting that "a mob awaited the referee, who had to be escorted to the car that carried him from a danger zone".

Alloa's attentions now moved to a quickfire double header against Hearts and Aberdeen with the fans hoping that Crilley's ankle injury wasn't too serious. More in the next edition of The Wasp.

A FAN'S VIEW

A shorter column for the match programme this week, as only 6 days have passed and a solitary match to really look back on since the last edition of The Wasp. Alloa take a break from the league campaign with this SPFL Trust Trophy 3rd round match against fellow League One rivals Airdrie. Moving the fixture to the Friday night was a good decision by all concerned. It gives the game a different feel having game under the floodlights for the first time this season. And from a selfish point of view, it avoids a bit of a

logistical dilemma trying to take in both this and the evening kickoff international between Scotland and Ireland should both matches have taken place on the Saturday. Tonight's match is a hard one to predict- Lassume both managers will utilise this game to provide some playing time for those who require it. Both clubs go into the fixture with confidence following results last week in the league. Airdrie recovered from their previous heavy defeat to FC Edinburgh by putting 5 goals past Clyde without reply. They are

now just a point behind leaders Dunfermline who drew with Falkirk. Meanwhile, Alloa moved up to 3rd position in the league table with a win over Montrose, just a couple of points behind tonight's opponents.


In terms of spectacle, last Saturdays match with Montrose didn't hit the heights of previous recent encounters between the clubs. But that mattered little to the Alloa support after picking up a vital 3 points. In their rather eye-catching pink and purple change kit, the visitors probably had the better of the first half chances. It was only later in the half where Alloa began making any real inroads towards goal. It was a welcome return to the starting line-up for Stefan Scougall and he looked very industrious. But the Montrose defence was resolute and gobbled up most of Alloa's creativity. Alloa were better after the break of course and broke the deadlock through a George Stanger header bundled home in a similar vein to his goal here against Peterhead a few weeks back. Alloa's backline, which included debutant David Devine,

looked comfortable and for a while it looked like a single goal would be enough to win the game. But they were undone by a brilliant Montrose equaliser-Blair Lyons looping overhead kick with 13 minutes remaining. Alloa pushed on for the win though and edged back in front late on with 2 substitutes combining for the goal. Adam King's high ball forward found Bradlev Rodden on the counter attack, and once again Rodden showed terrific composure to slot home with 3 minutes remaining. I was talking up Rodden in last week's match programme, and although I suspected Kieran Offord might start the game- I felt that Rodden could feel aggrieved to lose his place in the first eleven. However, his attitude and effort in this 20-minute cameo was a real plus point and he was the decisive factor in this game. Rodden's goal wasn't the last piece of action though- he played Ross Maclver through in stoppage time but keeper Sinclair did well to block his effort which would have sealed the points. Montrose threw the ball into the Alloa penalty area once more and Michael Gardyne's neat lay-off gave Paul Watson a great sight of goal on 94 minutes which he thankfully blazed wide of the target. It was a cagey stuffy game for much of the afternoon against a good team who will undoubtedly be challenging at the right end of the table again this season. But the 3 points were huge and keep Alloa's excellent run going with their 3rd successive victory.

Onto tonight's matchthis tournament is one of which both clubs will have fond memories in the past. Alloa of course won the trophy back in 1999 at Airdrie's stadium, and defeated them in the second round that season en route to their final victory. The two clubs also contested the final in 2001. Airdrie picked up the trophy that day but it was a very even match which was only decided in the closing stages. This was the Diamonds second consecutive Challenge Cup win having

defeated Livingston in the final the previous season. Taking Airdrie's historical timeline as a continuation rather than a split, the two clubs have reached 8 Finals between them. Interest in this competition amongst supporters doesn't tend to gather real momentum until the guarter finals- and the stop start nature of the tournament in recent seasons due to covid may have damaged the overall appeal of the tournament somewhat. However, with the Welsh and Irish clubs once again involved- there could be some interesting trips on the horizon if either club progresses in the tournament. Enjoy tonight's match.

Motherwell's defeat meant that they remained winless and still rooted to the bottom of the table, but Dundee's 1-0 win v Celtic moved them up three places from second-bottom spot. This was now occupied by Hearts, while Celtic, who'd made a rather inauspicious start to the season, slipped to a rather uncharacteristic placing of third-bottom.

In the First Division, table-toppers Airdrie enjoyed an emphatic 5-1 home success v struggling Partick, while second-placed Dunfermline were also triumphant on home

soil, by 3-0 v another side who'd failed to find form so far. Kilmarnock. Morton retained third spot thanks to a narrow 1-0 success at Cappielow v another of the strugglers, Queen Of The South, while todays visitors Ayr moved up to fourth thanks to a 2-1 victory v St. Johnstone at Somerset Park, Henry Templeton & John Sludden were The Honest Men's marksmen. At the bottom. Oueen of The South, in spite of their defeat still moved up to second-bottom spot, as The Doonhamers

now had a superior goal difference to Partick, who thus slipped to last place, while Raith, beaten 0-1 at Forfar, remained third from bottom.

Down in the Second, Arbroath retained leadership despite having to settle for a point from a 0-0 draw at East Fife, while Queen's Park's 1-1 draw at Albion Rovers was enough to move The Spiders into second place, they displaced Stirling Albion, who dropped to third following a 2-3 home reverse v Cowdenbeath.

Entrusted with his first player-manager role, the squad expressed their delight with the appointment of McCabe and that sense of continuity. He is assisted by fellow defensive partner, and cousin, Callum Fordyce. THE CAPTAIN - CAL-LUM FORDYCE

As well as the assistant manager, Callum Fordyce still holds the armband and will lead the side out tonight. He began his senior career at Livingston following his departure from the Hibernian vouth academy and was part of a very successful Livingston side. The centre back has actually won this cup tournament in his last season at Livingston where he captained the team to a Challenge Cup victory against Alloa in 2015. Spells at Dunfermline and Queen of the South would follow before moving to Airdrie in 2019. Another vital piece of the Airdrie team, Fordyce adds an element of composure and steel to the defence and is an ever-present in their team.

NEW BOY -CHARLIE TELFER

McCabe finally announced the signing of former Falkirk midfielder Charlie Telfer this month. The dynamic winger left Falkirk after 3 years at the club and rumours had been circulating that he had been training with fellow league rivals since his departure. Telfer burst onto the scene in 2014 making his senior debut for Rangers and he immediately caught the eye with plenty suitors wanting to pay a lot of money for his services. After turning down the chance to stay at Rangers, he signed for Dundee United for a fee believed to be in the region of £200,000 and went on to spend a few years at the club before moving to Holland with Almere City. That stint was short and sweet as he returned a year later

to play for Greenock Morton, however, after a chaotic time for the club going through managerial changes, he departed and joined Falkirk. Since joining Airdrie recently, he made his debut in the 5-0 demolition of Clyde at the weekend.

ONE TO WATCH -CALUM GALLAGHER

This evening's one to watch will need no introduction to the Alloa fans given his history both for Alloa and most prominently against Alloa. Callum Gallagher did spend a brief spell on loan at the Wasps from Rangers back in 2012, however, it is his form since his move to Airdrie that has caught the eve and been a thorn to many Alloa sides. The striker is already on 4 goals this season, including a strike in the sides last meeting in August where Airdrie won 2-0. This goal scoring form has just continued on from last season where he found the back of the net 16 times, a few again were against tonight's home side.

THE CONNECTION

THREE OF THE BEST..... WHAT IF MOMENTS

1. BILLY BLACKIE/ JOHN GIBSON- HIBS VS ALLOA, SCOTTISH CUP QUARTER FINAL 18TH MARCH 1989

Second Division Alloa made the trip to Easter Road for this last 8 Scottish Cup tie in good league form- and the Scottish Cup was providing a welcome distraction for the Wasps having despatched of Berwick Rangers, Forres Mechanics, Albion Rovers and First Division Oueen of the South in previous rounds. They caused Hibs problems in the game embryonic

stages, passing up two glorious early chances. In the opening minutes Billy Blackie found himself clean through on goal for the Wasps but blazed his shot over the bar. Hibs keeper Andy Goram admittedly did well, acting quickly to narrow the angle- but it was a great opportunity to take the lead. And minutes later Mungo McCallums looping cross into the penalty area found John Gibson at the back post, but he completely missed his connection as he tried to head the ball home

from 6 yards. Hibs eventually took the lead iust after the half hour mark, when a loe Tortalono cross took a wicked deflection looping over the head of Alloa keeper Ronnie Lowrie, Paul Kane stabbed home at the back post and that proved to be the only goal of the game. Had Alloa converted one or even both of those early chances I think theres a good chance they could have faced Celtic in the semi finals at Hampdenwhich would have been arguably the biggest match in the clubs history at that point. Hibs struggled to break down the Wasps that day, and when they did-found Lowrie to be in inspired form between the sticks. Celtic effectively killed the semi final off after 30 minutes with Hibs conceding 3 early goals- and in all honesty its likely the Glasgow giants would have had too much and Alloa would have suffered a similar fate. A hiding there may have also derailed Alloas promotion bid somewhat-whereas they used the confidence gained in running

Hibs close as a platform for a brilliant end of season run. They clinched promotion in the final game of the season against Dumbarton at Boghead.

2. CRAIG GORDON/ GREIG SPENCE- CELTIC VS ALLOA, LEAGUE CUP QUARTER FINAL 21ST SEPTEMBER 2016

Another quarter final appearance for Alloathis time in the League Cup under Jack Ross in 2016. Alloa gualified for the knockout stages of the tournament with a perfect record of 4 wins over Cove Rangers, Montrose, Raith Rovers and holders Ross County. They then caused an upset in the last 16- eliminating another Premiership team Inverness Caledonian Thistle through a lason Marr goal. They were handed the toughest possible draw for their last eight tie- facing Brendan Rodgers Celtic team containing the likes of Kieran Tierney, Patrick Roberts, Moussa Dembele and Tom Rogic, Alloa spent much of the first half on the back foot, but the tie remained goal less as half time approached. The games controversial moment occurred right before the break. A looping pass from Jim Goodwin created a huge opening for striker Greig Spence who had managed to outrun experienced Celtic defender Kolo Toure. Celtic goalkeeper Craig Gordon came

flying out of his penalty area, pole-axing Spence with what could only be described as a kick of the kung fu variety. Gordon received only a booking for the offence, which looked a clear red card-more resembling an assault than a tackle. Celtic finally broke Alloas resolve with two goals in the final ten minutes through James Forrest and Moussa Dembele. Of course, we never know what may have happened if Celtic were to play out the rest of the game a man down. Whilst it would have made proceedings a lot more interesting, I'm doubtful Alloa would have left Parkhead with a win regardless. Celtic had an invincible campaign that season, winning all three domestic trophies without losing a single game. With that in mind, I suspect they would have found a way to win regardless.

3. DARIO ZANATTA- ST MIRREN VS ALLOA, SCOTTISH CUP 4TH ROUND, 19TH JANU-ARY 2019

Alloa again approached this cup tie in good league form and relishing the prospect of testing themselves against manager lim Goodwins former club. Alloa were in the Scottish Championship and unbeaten in their previous 4 games, winning 3 of them- against Morton, Oueen of the South and Dundee United. They carried this confidence into the tie, putting the hosts to the sword with some scintillating football in the opening half. They led 2-0 at the break, first through Alan Trouten, followed by a sublime Kevin Cawley goal. St Mirren were also reduced to ten men, with Brad Lyons receiving two vellow cards. A lifeline arrived for the Buddies after 68 minutes when goalkeeper Neil Parry

spilled a shot at the feet of substitute Cody Cooke who reduced the deficit. But 5 minutes later. Alloa forward Dario Zanatta embarked on a mazy run, cutting inside and clipping the post with his shot. Had Zanatta scored it would have surely killed the tie and sent the Wasps into the next round following a brilliant upset win. As it transpired, Alloa energy levels depleted in the closing stages and St Mirren scored 2 goals in the last 5 minutes to progress. It was an agonising way to exit the cup, on a day where Alloa had played some terrific stuff for much of the game. The nature of the defeat affected Alloa's domestic formlosing the next 4 games. But they regrouped and following another great end of season run managed to consolidate their place in the Championship for another campaign.


